Winter Night Shelter

Well, the night shelter closed its doors on Tuesday 1st March and we can all be thankful that it provided a safe and warm environment for our guests and volunteers too for the last 12 weeks.

As we write this note to you the sun is shining with blue skies but the temperature is still deceptively cold. Many of you have asked if we could extend the night shelter into March and it would be good to say "yes let's just do it." However, wisdom tells us that this would create many issues such as the availability of the venues and volunteers, fatigue, and the impact on volunteers returning next year. We have given thought to this idea but concluded we should open and close when we say we will so everyone knows what to expect. There has to be an end date at some point and it could easily still be cold through March and April. We hope you will all understand this.

Although our numbers can help to tell the story about the impact of the shelter on our guests, the real success is about your commitment to bring your compassion and servant hearts to our friends who would be sleeping on the streets if not for you.

Some brief facts will help put this into context:

- 69 individuals applied and were interviewed
- 59 were given access to come in
- 6 were refused and 4 found alternative accommodation before coming in
- 999 bed nights were given
- 9 individuals were excluded over the 3 months
- 91 days x 3 = 273 shifts covered by an average of 4 volunteers per shift giving a total of over 6000 volunteer hours to the local community

If you pray, please pray for the men in The Bridge during this time of transition that they will settle quickly, and for the staff and volunteers working with them. Continue to pray that The Bridge will provide a bridge from homelessness to independent living, from an old to a new life, from hopelessness to hope.
